Work & Thrive Newcastle

Employment partnership goes from strength to strength

Our employment partnership is supporting more Newcastle residents than ever with improved access to high quality employment support and good work opportunities.

Funded by the North East Combined Authority, Work & Thrive puts the needs of local people, young people, and employers at the heart of everything it does. Partners include Newcastle City Council (including Newcastle Futures, Newcastle Careers, Newcastle Housing Employability, Connect to Work, and Newcastle City Learning), Department of Work and Pensions, National Careers Service, and other training providers and community organisations, including Newcastle United, King's Trust, and the College.



The partnership's good work includes:

- Newcastle Career's and Future's Teams provide free personalised advice to any young person aged 16-18 (Careers), and up to 25 with an EHCP plan (Futures) who is looking for a place in education, training, an Apprenticeship, or a job with training. This includes help with writing or updating a CV, helping to find vacancies, writing job applications, and preparing for interviews. Both teams offer outreach services at libraries, and children and community hubs.
- In 2024, Work & Thrive supported over 2,000 appointments to residents, and recruitment fairs and employment support events helped over 1,500 Newcastle residents take steps into employment and/or training.
- An ESOL (English for Speakers of Other Languages) service was set up in 2024 to help anyone over 16 improve their English and find a job or training. In the first year of delivery, the ESOL service supported over 1,000 residents, and has helped over 1,500 residents as of the summer 2025.

Regeneration Brainery is Coming to Newcastle!

Are your students curious about how cities are shaped and the roles behind the places we live, work, and play? Regeneration Brainery gives young people the chance to explore regeneration, property, and the built environment in a hands-on, exciting way. We connect students with industry experts, helping them discover careers, build practical skills, and see how education links to the real world.

From 3rd-7th November, we are running a FREE five-day immersive programme in Newcastle for students aged 14 and above, where they will explore a wide range of industry roles, from project management and surveying to facilities management, interior design, community engagement and tonnes more. All whilst gaining employability skills in teambuilding, networking, giving presentations, creating a banging CV, and bagging that all important job role.

During the week, students will:

- Dive into interactive workshops and real-life projects
- Visit inspiring workspaces and industry sites
- Meet graduates, industry leaders, and global experts to explore career pathways and hear their inspiring stories
- Build essential soft skills through teamwork activities, networking, and CV workshops

There's a role in property for every interest:

- E Love Law? Explore Construction or Property Law
- 🜃 Geography fan? Try Town Planning or Environmental Consultancy
- → Maths whiz? Consider Quantity Surveying or Property Investment Banking
- Creative at heart? Architecture or Urban Design could be the dream role

Whatever their strengths or interests, students can find a role in shaping places and spaces, and the Brainery Bootcamp is the perfect place to start exploring.

The Brainery supports Gatsby Benchmarks, giving students the chance to meet employers, gain career guidance, and explore pathways into a growing and exciting industry. Past participants have gone on to secure work experience, internships, apprenticeships, and graduate roles.

Our programmes are completely free, and we take care of all logistics, so there is no extra workload for teachers.

MCR Pathways is an award-winning, relationship-based mentoring programme, working to level the playing field so all young people can achieve their ambitions.

When you've had the most unfair start in life, it's easy to lose your way for the rest of your life. For too many young people, an unfair start means navigating life's toughest challenges alone. But mentoring builds confidence, instils belief, awakens ambitions, and expands their future horizons.

Mentoring not only improves a young person's educational attainment, career aspirations, and life chances, it's also incredibly rewarding for the mentor. Supporting someone to reach their full potential can increase your own confidence, develop communication skills, and give a deep sense of fulfilment and purpose.

This month, we launched our programme in Jesmond Park Academy, Excelsior Academy and Callerton Academy, and there is an urgent need for mentors. You don't need any specific skills or prior experience to become a mentor; all you need is a willingness to make a positive impact. Mentors dedicate an hour each week listening to and encouraging a young person in their school, empowering them to believe in themselves and their abilities.
